Detroiters Working for Environmental Justice issue statement on Clean Power Plan oral arguments

DETROIT, Mich. – **Kimberly Hill Knott**, director of policy for **Detroiters Working for Environmental Justice** issued the following statement today regarding oral arguments on the Clean Power Plan taking place in front of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia.

“Air pollution and the effects of climate change are detrimental to the health of people in Detroit and across Michigan. Low-income and communities of color suffer from the effects of air pollution the most, which is why the Clean Power Plan is essential to protecting these communities. Attorney General Schuette’s attack on these important clean air protections is reckless and out of touch with the people of Michigan. The Clean Power Plan will save lives by ensuring all Michiganders have clean air to breathe, and we urge Schuette to end his attack on cleaner, safer energy.”
